RIGHT WING , LEFT WING

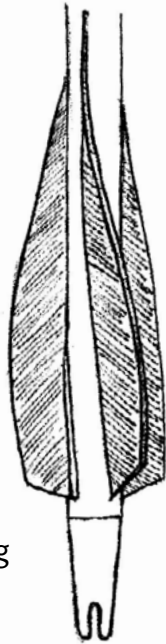
Many times we have been asked “What bevel broadhead do I need” or “How do I tell what hand feather or fletch I have” These are very good questions as a mismatched bevel and fletch combination can cost an archer substantial penetration.

The bevel of the broadhead should match the feather or fletch of the shaft in which it is to be mounted on.

Tip of fletching

If the tip of fletching is to the left of the tail of the fletching as shown in sketch it is a left wing fletch

Tail of fletching

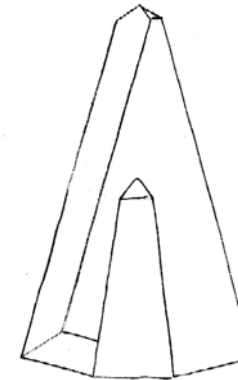


RIGHT WING , LEFT WING FLETCHING

The way to determine the hand of fletching is to position the arrow as shown to the left with the tip pointing up or away from you. The side that the tip is on in relation to the tail is the hand of the fletching. Left wing rotates CCW as viewed from the rear of the arrow and right wing rotates CW as viewed from the rear of the arrow

RIGHT BEVEL , LEFT BEVEL

The way to determine the bevel of the broadhead is to position the head as shown in the sketch with the tip pointing up or away from you. Now the side that the bevel is visible on is the hand or bevel of the broadhead or left hand or bevel as shown on right.



Bevel on left as shown in sketch is a Left Bevel Abowyer Bonehead
